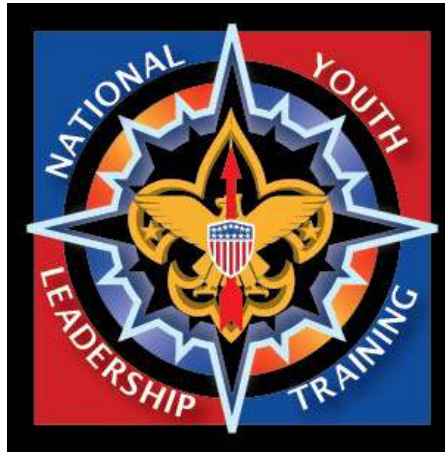

National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) is an exciting, action-packed program designed to provide youth members with leadership skills and experiences they can use in their home troops, teams, crews, personal lives, and in other situations demanding leadership of self and others.

What to Expect at NYLT

NYLT is an exciting six-day course. It is not just another week of Scout Camp! Leadership is taught in a Troop setting to make the learning fun and allow immediate application of the leadership principles taught. The program provides a challenging and rewarding learning experience in a combination of fun classroom and outdoor activities.

Patrols are created with participants from different home units to allow participants to make new friends and learn the steps involved in team building. Teamwork is reinforced by cooking meals and actively competing and working together as patrols throughout the course.

It is an honor to be selected for this course. **Attendance for the whole course is expected and is required for completion.** Participants must plan to remain for the entire time to complete the course.

To focus on learning, no electronics will be allowed. This includes cell phones, iPods, MP3, etc. Please leave all electronics at home. Any electronics brought to camp will be stored for return upon checkout, or sent home with the driver. Phones will be readily available for necessary calls.

There will be lots of fun, making of new lifelong friends, and creative challenges. Many participants find the course so rewarding that they volunteer to return and staff the next year.

Refunds

Deposits are not refundable. In the event of accident, illness, or extreme extenuating circumstances, refunds of **up to 50%** of camp fees may be made if requested in writing at least 15 days prior to your scheduled arrival at camp.

Refund requests must be submitted in writing to the Camping Department..

What to Bring to Camp

After your registration is accepted, you will receive a welcome email with a list of what to bring to NYLT. In general a participant will bring camping gear for five nights and six days. Food and cookware for meals is provided. Be sure to indicate shirt size on the application form to insure proper fit of the provided course tee shirt.

Who May Attend

Boy Scouts and Varsity Scouts who are at least First Class and will be 13 by the start of the course may attend. All Venturing Crew members may attend.

Coed Venturing

Session One (July): Because of the difference in staffing requirements Session One will accommodate both female and male Venturers.

Session Two (August): Session Two will accommodate only male Venturers. Venturers should keep this distinction in mind when reserving course time. Strict adherence to Youth Protection rules will be maintained.
