Belt Loops

Archery & BB Shooting

Can be earned at Archery and BB Shooting rotations

Other Belt Loops may be completed during Activity Pin classes, refer to the area staff for specifics.

Wolf Trail

- 1h- Swim as far as you can walk in fifteen steps.
- 1i- Tread water for 15 seconds or as long as you can. Do Your Best.
Any cub that completed the beginners or swimmers level at the swim beach
- 2a, 2b, 2e, 2f, 2g – Flag ceremonies and folding
These can be done in the campsites with supervision of the Staff Host or Den Leader.
- 3c- Show what to do for a small cut on your finger.
Can be done during the Readyman advancement class, along with more advanced first aid skills
- 6b- Make a collection of anything you like.
Visiting the nature area is a good start for rock collections
- 10c- Plan a walk. Go to a park or a wooded area, or visit a zoo or museum with your family.
This requirement is fulfilled in the Nature Walk at the Nature area.

Electives

- 2d- Be the announcer for a skit.
The scouts have the chance to do this their friendship fires.
- 4f- Play a wide area or large group game with your pack or den
Attending the nightly camp-wide games can fulfill this requirement.
- 11f- Sing a song with your den at a pack meeting
Singing at one of the friendship campfires will fulfill this requirement
- 12a, 12b, 12c-
Can be completed by going to the craft lodge during advancement and open area times
- 17a- Learn to tie an overhand knot and a square knot.
- 17e- Tie two cords together with an overhand knot.
The scouts will do this at the Knots rotation at the Outdoor Skills area.
- 17g- Whip the ends of a rope to keep it from unwinding.
Attending an Outdoorsman activity pin class will complete this requirement
- 20b- Know boating safety rules.
This is done during the Rowing rotation at the beach.
- 20c- Know archery safety rules. Know how to shoot properly.
This will be done during the rotations at Archery Range.
- 20n- Earn the Cub Scouting shooting sports BB-gun Belt loop.
Attending the BB rotation will sufficiently cover the BB belt loop requirements.
- 23a, 23f-
Attending Camp Brinkley completes these requirements
- 23g- Participate with your den at a campfire in front of your pack
Performing at one of the two friendship campfires is encouraged
- 23h- With your den or pack or family, participate in a worship service outdoors
Two nondenominational Scout's Own services are conducted each week

Bear Trail

3f, 3h, 3i- Flag ceremonies

These can be done in the campsites with supervision of the Staff Host or Den Leader

9b- With an adult make snacks for the next den meeting.

9g- With an adult, cook something in the outdoors

9b and 9g can be done as part of the Cooking Rotation at Outdoor Skills.

10a- Go on a trip with members of your family.

If coming to camp is with the cub scouts family, this requirement is fulfilled.

11b- Tell what to do in case of a water accident.

This will be covered at the Swim Beach.

11f- Have a health check up by a physician.

To come to camp all campers must a physical, completing this requirement.

19a- Know the safety rules for handling a knife.

19b- Show that you know how to take care of and use a pocketknife.

19d- Earn the Whittling Chip card.

These can be done at the Outdoor Skills area during Open Areas.

21a- Build a model from a kit

Several models can be purchased in the craft lodge and put together

22a- Whip the ends of a rope

The Outdoorsman advancement class will cover whipping rope

22b- Tie a square knot, bowline, sheet bend, two half hitches, and slipknot.

These can be tied at the Outdoor Skills area during rotations and open areas.

Electives

5e- Know the rules of boat safety.

This is completed during the Rowing rotation at the beach.

9a- Do an original art project and show it at a pack meeting

A collage or clay sculpture can be made in the craft lodge during advancement or open areas

15d- What is erosion?

This can be done at Nature area during rotations.

19a, 19b, 19c, 19d-

These are completed if scouts finish their beginner or swimmers tests at the Beach.

20a- In archery, know the safety rules and how to shoot correctly.

This is done during the rotation at the Archery Range.

25a- Learn about the ten essential items you need for a campout or hike

The ten essentials are discussed in the Outdoorsman advancement session

25c- Participate with your den in front of the pack at a campfire

Performing during one of two friendship fires completes this requirement

25e- Participate with your den in a religious service during an overnight campout

Two nondenominational Scout's Own services are conducted each week

25g- Attend a resident camp in your area

Attending Camp Brinkley satisfies this requirement
